NOTE ON GEOGRAPHICAL TERMS

Traditionally, Tibet was comprised of three main regions: U-Tsang, Kham, and Amdo. Following what many consider an unlawful occupation by China, these areas were reorganised into an Autonomous Region, Provinces, Autonomous Prefectures, and Autonomous Counties. In this report, the village names used are based on the original designations found in Chinese sources.

Introduction:



In this report, I have endeavoured to analyse and to ascertain the backgrounds of the CCP Party secretaries, including those at both prefecture and county levels stationed along the Indian border. Understanding the profiles of CCP officials in top decision-making positions within prefectures and counties along the India border is crucial to discerning Chinese motivations in the region, along with the progression of physical infrastructure development. In addition, this report also examines the well-off "Xiaokang" villages located in each county along the Indian border.

In Chinese literature, Xiaokang villages are seen as part of national boundary reinforcement and poverty alleviation, whereas in Western literature, they are viewed as a potential threat to neighbouring countries border security due to the ambiguous military-civilian dual-use structure of these villages. In July 2017, the government of Tibet Autonomous Region announced plans to construct hundreds of border villages and accompanying infrastructure as part of a significant effort to develop Tibet's remote border regions. These Xiaokang villages are being built under the theme: "If the border is prosperous, the frontier will be prosperous, and if the border people are wealthy, the border defence will be solid. 边境兴则边疆兴,边民富则边防固" and "Guardians of the sacred land, builders of happy homes."

However, numerous reports claim that between 2018 and 2022, 624 villages were built in the region, with construction continuing on additional villages. Many of these villages are clustered along the eastern sector of the Line of Actual Control (LAC), the de facto border separating China (Tibet) and India, with this sector bordering Arunachal Pradesh. Moreover, a 2021 article in the official newspaper, PLA Daily, emphasises the "need to strengthen the construction of border infrastructure and encourage people of all ethnic groups to root themselves in the border areas, guard the homeland, and build their hometowns" in this region.


Due to strict censorship, it is difficult to determine the precise number of "Xiaokang Villages." Nevertheless, this report strives to provide the most information as much as possible.

The analysis encompasses four prefectures adjacent to India—Ngari, Shigatse, Shannan, and Nyingchi—concentrating on their respective Party secretaries. The report also includes the Party secretaries of the 13 counties and the "Xiaokang villages" within those counties along the Indian border.


KEY OBSERVATIONS:

- All Party secretaries, at both prefecture and county levels, are Han Chinese officials.
- Most Party deputy secretaries are non-Han (Tibetan) officials in both prefecture and county levels.
- On average, party officials overseeing Indian border prefecture/counties have around 12 years of administrative experiences.
- Most Party secretaries possess at least an undergraduate degree.






Pie Chart-1 shows the ethnic composition of Prefecture-level Party Secretaries (1/4 ratio).




Pie Chart-2 shows the age composition of Prefecture-level Party Secretaries.

Ngari Prefecture, located in the Tibet Autonomous Region of China, is often referred to as the "ancestor of all mountains" and the "source of all rivers." It shares borders with Nepal and India (including Ladakh), with a border length of 1,170 kilometres. Ngari Prefecture comprises of seven counties, of which only four counties share a border with India.

- 3. Gar County
- 4. Purang County

Xiaokang villages in Zanda County:

The exact number of Xiaokang villages in Zanda County is not fixed, but one village, called Zaburang/Zabujang Village, was established around 2020 with the assistance of Hebei Province. Since the 18th Party Congress, Shijiazhuang City in Hebei Province has been tasked with the responsibility of developing Zanda County by the Party Central Committee under the aid to Tibet or paired-up assistance scheme.

In Zanda county approximately 22 aid-to-Tibet projects from the 13th Five-Year Plan have been completed. The 14th Five-Year Plan (2021-25) is also in progress, with 44 projects planned, including the school water supply, Xiangzi characteristic tourism town, and a convenient service centre. As of now, around half of these projects are believed to be completed, though no specific data is available.

From 2018 to 2019, Purang County invested a total of more than 13 million yuan, based on the standard of 50,000 yuan per person, to build the <u>Rengong Well-off Village</u>. The housing area per person is not less than 30 square meters and not more than 50 square meters.

Shigatse (Ch:Xigaze) Prefecture





Shigatse is a prefecture-level city in the Tibet Autonomous Region of China, covering 179,903 square kilometres. Historically, it has been the residence of the Panchen Lama, one of the major leaders of the Tibetan Buddhism, and is recognised as a national historical and cultural city by China's State Council. The city's borders extend 1,507 kilometres, measuring 800 km from east to west and 220 km from north to south. It comprises 17 counties, 1 district, and 1 city.

Xiaokang villages in Gamba County:

In recent years, <u>Gamba County has promoted the development of border well-off villages through projects</u> focused on water, electricity, roads, communication, education, and more. By 2017, village planning for nine villages, including Jiru and Dangga, was completed, covering housing renovation, infrastructure, public services, and environmental protection. Over 110 million yuan has been allocated for residential renovations, and infrastructure design for eight villages, including Longzhong and Beicun, is nearly complete. <u>In February 2022, Beicun Village</u> was selected into the list of proposed names for the 2021 Tibet Autonomous Region Ecological Civilization Construction Demonstration Village. <u>Since 2002, Gangba County in Tibet has been supported by Sinochem Group.</u> The company has utilised its industrial strengths, implemented targeted local measures, and invested 135 million yuan in aid. It has sent six groups of 12 cadres to Tibet, promoting Gangba's economic and social development while improving livelihoods.

Xiaokang villages in Yadong County:

Yadong County has accelerated the construction of border well-off villages. With a total investment of 284.604 million yuan, the project aims to resettle 100 households and 450 people from high-altitude townships in the northern part of the county. The planned land area for Resettlement Site No. 2 is 25,426 square metres, with a total construction area of 6,541.6 square metres. All construction tasks were expected to be completed by the end of August 2020. However, the exact number of such villages is difficult to determine. According to a recent report by The New York Times, "China's Great Wall of Villages," it is estimated that there are around 9 to 11 such villages in Yadong, including in disputed areas. Through my research, I came across one such well-developed village in Yadong County, namely Xiayadong Village.

<u>Shannan Prefecture</u>, historically known as Yalong, is a prefecture-level city in Tibet Autonomous Region. It borders Lhasa to the north, Shigatse to the west, Nyingchi to the east, and India and Bhutan to the south. Covering 79,090 square kilometres, it accounts for about one-fifteenth of Tibet's total area. Shannan City shares a 600-kilometre border with Bhutan and holds strategic importance as part of China's southwestern frontier bordering the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh.


Xiaokang villages in Lhunze County:




